Presentation of PSEG Puerto Rico to the Partnership Committee

Members of the Partnership Committee expressed their views with respect to the presentation made by various members of PSEG Puerto Rico's management team. The Partnership Committee Members discussed (i) PSEG's experience in running the electric system for the State of New Jersey, (ii) its extensive experience with storm response and clean energy initiatives, (iii) PSEG's past efforts to transform the electric system in Long Island, New York, and (iv) PSEG's assistance following Hurricane Maria. The Partnership Committee then discussed PSEG Puerto Rico's proposal for the Front-End Transition.

Presentation of LUMA to the Partnership Committee

Members of the Partnership Committee expressed their views with respect to the presentation made by the LUMA consortium, which includes Quanta Services Inc., ATCO Ltd. and Innovative Emergency Management, Inc. The Partnership Committee discussed (i) the qualifications of each of the consortium members, (ii) LUMA's approach to transforming the Puerto Rico electric system, (iii) LUMA's proposal for the Front-End Transition, and (iv) LUMA's approach to the operation and management services, including vegetation management, system reliability, federal funding and emergency response.
